

Hotel Lycium****

4026 Debrecen, Hunyadi utca 1-3.

Hotel Lycium is in the heart of Eastern Hungary's most dynamically developing city, Debrecen, in the direct vicinity of the Great Church and Déri Museum.

The name of the hotel originates from a rarity of nature – a plant that has grown into a tree: *Lycium halimifolium*. According to the anecdote, an ardent apostle of Reformation, Minister Bálint had an argument with the Catholic priest, Ambrosius. In the fever of the dispute, Ambrosius broke off a branch of lycium, and laughing he stuck it in the ground, and said: "It [Reformation] will become a religion when this branch has grown into a tree." Indeed, it has grown into a tree, as the Reformed Church has also become the most prevailing religion in this city of Hungary.

There are 88 air-conditioned rooms and 4 apartments in the hotel. The rooms are provided with specially designed internal terraces to offer pleasant scenes of relaxation, pastimes. The rooms have bathrooms with shower, and are equipped with pay-TV, telephone, Internet connection, security safe, minibar, hair-dryer, individually adjustable air-conditioning.

The price of the room includes the accommodation, the buffet breakfast, free use of wellness centre (indoor swimming pool, sauna, fitness room) and Internet connection, VAT and city tax.

Check-in is after 2 pm on the arrival day, and guests are kindly requested to leave the rooms by 10 am on the day of departure. In case of checking out after 10.30 am, the hotel reserves the right to charge 50% of the rack rate as a surcharge.

Parking is HUF 2.500/car/night (approx. 9,6 Euro).

The hotel and Kölcsey Convention Centre is within the same block, and are connected with an inner passage.
